If the employee was protected with proper PPE for the level of risk no additional action is necessary.  If the employee was not protected with the correct PPE seek Employee Health guidance (x23358 or 415-297-8516.  Supervisor should provide the PUI name and last 4 so EH can follow-up results.	If a PUI is ruled in as COVID-19 positive, refer to case exposure protocol above.  Contact Employee Health (EH) at x23358 or at 415-297-8516 from where you are and follow their instructions.	If the employee was not appropriately protected in a high risk exposure scenario, we may recommend that the employee be removed from the workplace even while the PUI is ruled out or ruled in. Contact Employee Health at x23358 or at 415-297-8516.
No symptoms. No known exposure.	CONITUNE AT WORK.	The SFVAHCS is not currently performing testing in persons who have NO SYMPTOMS, except for repeated testing as part of special surveillance (e.g., for all CLC staff) or as part of an outbreak investigation.	NO  Follow up with your primary care provider or obtain free testing at an SF site for testing asymptomatic frontline workers.
